

Asthma Audit Development Project (AADP): Information for children (4-7 years old)

What is the AADP?

The AADP is helping to **get ready for an Asthma Audit**.

What is an Asthma Audit?

The Asthma Audit will **ask hospitals in England and Wales questions**.

These questions will **help hospitals make sure they give people with asthma better care**.

What will the AADP do?

The AADP will:

- find **what bits of asthma care need to be made better**
- pick **questions to ask hospitals on how they make people with asthma feel better**
- ask **hospitals to test the questions**
- **learn from the test and get ready to start the Asthma Audit**

What does this mean?

About 35 hospitals will test the questions.

If **you go to one of these hospitals**, because your asthma is bad or you are wheezy, **they may have to answer the questions about how they made you feel better**.

You **will not** need to answer any questions and the AADP team **will not know the answers are about you**.

The questions will be tested from **11 September – 8 October 2017**.
