

Asthma Audit Development Project: Information for children (8 years and older)



The **Asthma Audit Development Project (AADP)** will run between November 2016 and February 2018.

What is the AADP?

The AADP is helping to **set up a project** looking at **asthma care in England and Wales**. This will be called the **Asthma Audit**.

What is an Asthma Audit?

An audit is a **project** which looks at **whether something is working in the right way**.

The Asthma Audit will ask **hospitals question** to **help** them see how **good their asthma care is** and how they can **improve it**.

It **aims to make asthma care better**.

What will the AADP do?

The AADP will:

- look at what **areas of asthma care need to be made better**
- find **questions that can be asked** to help hospitals give better care
- ask **hospitals to test the questions** to make sure they can be answered properly
- **learn from the test and get ready** to start the Asthma Audit

The questions will be tested from **11 September 2017** for **four weeks**.

How does it affect me?

About 35 hospitals will test the questions.

If **you go to one of these hospitals** with an **asthma attack** and you have to stay, **they may have to answer the questions** about **how they treated you**.

You will not need to answer any questions and the AADP team **will not know the answers are about you**.
